

Background:- Irrigation Water use Sector

- 2014/15 WARMS Data:
 - 35 642
 registered
 water users
 - 1 440 748 ha of registered irrigation area



Legal grounds for the regulations

- The Department_ ensure that the nation's water resources are protected, used, developed, conserved, managed and controlled in a sustainable and equitable manner_ basic human needs, redress past and racial discrimination, facilitating social and economic development.....
- S 26(1)(b) of the NWA permits the Minister to make these regulations;
- S 69 to 71 prescribe the process to make the regulations;
- Schedule 3 (4)(1a) A catchment management agency may require in writing that a water user -
- (a) install a recording or monitoring device to monitor storing, abstraction and use of water;

Regulations:- Requirements

- Prescribe requirements and procedures to be followed;
- Impose measurement requirements and conditions on water use permissible as continuation of an Existing Lawful Use;
- Establish powers, offences and penalties for noncompliant to the regulation;
- Licenses, GA and existing Permits have conditions to measure.

Application: Regulation and Instruction to IB & WUA's

- Regulations were gazetted for implementation on 17
 February 2017;
- Responsible authority- instruct water users who are required to measure the water taken for irrigation purposes;
- Instruction to Irrigation Board and Water User Association (05/02/2018)_ installation to be done 1 month from the date of publication;
 - To instruct their water user members
- The Regulations apply to all taking of water from a water resource for the purpose of <u>irrigation</u> where the water user is <u>required to measure</u> such water

IRRIGATION BOARDS AND WATER USERS ASSOCIATIONS INSTRUCTION TO INSTALL WATER MEASURING DEVICES FOR WATER TAKEN FOR IRRIGATION PURPOSES AND TO MONITOR COMPLIANCE TO REGULATIONS REQUIRING THAT THE TAKING OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION PURPOSES BE MEASURED, RECORDED AND REPORTED

I, Sifiso Mkhize, in my capacity as Acting Director-General of the Department of Water and Sanitation, on reasonable grounds believe that a water shortage may exists on/in most catchments around the country, and that there is poor compliance to provisions of Government Notice No. 131 of 2017 (Regulations requiring that the taking of water for irrigation purposes be measured, recorded and reported), Section 22(2) and Section 63 (1) as well as item 4 of Schedule 3 of the Water Act of 1998 (Act 36 of 1998) in exercising water use, instruct all Irrigation Boards and Water Users Associations in the country to install water measuring devices for water taken for irrigation purposes and to monitor compliance to Government Notice No. 131 of 2017.

Irrigation Boards and Water Users Associations that have water use authorizations to abstract are required to install water measuring devices one month from the date of publication of this notice. The measuring devices must be selected, installed, operated and maintained according to Government Notice 131 of 2017. This requirement supersedes any other requirement to measure that may have issued, including conditions attached to the water use authorization.

Irrigations Boards and Water users Associations are to instruct their water user members to install water measuring devices in line with Government Notice 131 of 2017. Water users are required to submit water measuring records on a monthly basis directly or through the Water Users Association or Irrigations Board depending on their location, to one of the following e-mails:

Water users taking water in different Water Management Areas are to submit measuring records according to the location of their properties where water is taken.


Irrigation Boards and Water Users Associations are to monitor compliance of their water user members to the measuring requirements contained in Government Notice 131 of 2017. Irrigation Boards and Water Users Associations are to provide investigation or compliance reports to the Provincial Heads of the Department of Water and Sanitation in cases of noncompliance in order to initiate enforcement process in terms of Sections 53 and 54 of the National Water Act of 1998 (Act 36 of 1998).

- Requirements for installing self-registering measuring devices (a-g)....-5
- Keeping, storing records and reporting (a-c)...-6
- Directive to comply- responsible authority may direct a water user to comply with Reg. 5.. -7
- Directive to verify the accuracy of measuring devices-8
- Offences_ guilty of an offence-9
- Penalties- liable to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding five years-10

Guideline_ Cont..

- The regulator prescribes functionality not a brand
- Requirements for all measuring types:-
 - Scope of measurement, accuracy of measurement, measuring location, measuring system...
- Measuring flow in full pipes;
 - Off-the shelf devices_ range of expected flow rates, operation maintenance...
- Measuring flow in open channel or partially full pipe;
 - Designed, constructed and rated structures_ channel gradient, shape and construction...
- Data management
 - Measuring, record keeping and submission
- Accuracy of the devices
 - Verification of the accuracy of the measuring device
